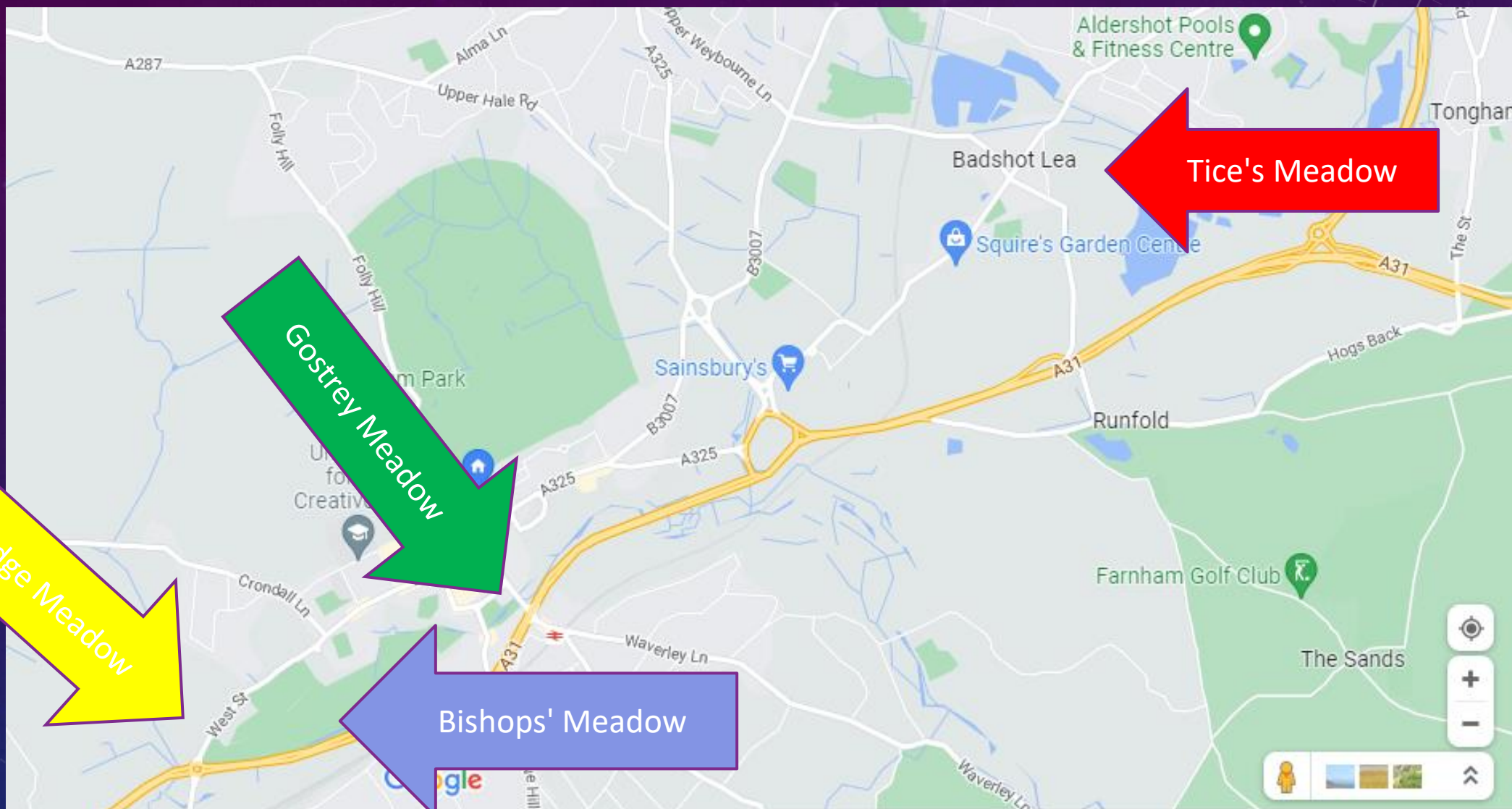
What is a House?
