## FOSTERING A LOVE OF READING FOR PLEASURE

- Read with your child as much as possible bedtime is a great time to wind down with a story and bond with each other.
- Ask older siblings to read with the younger ones whilst you're cooking dinner.
   The older ones will love to be teacher, & you can remind them to be really encouraging and say how proud they are when the younger one does well.
- Let them choose the books even if it's a fact book, read out some of the
  information and then discuss it with them. They'll enjoy discussing their
  interests with you, & if they like the topic they're more likely to want to read
  the book!
- Kids like funny. Try reading a funny book to get their interest. The younger ones are loving 'This Book Has No Pictures' which forces their adult to read out silly words and phrases (the more you ham up hating it the funnier it is!).
- Don't force it. It's not fun for anyone if you're having to battle every night to
  make them sit down and read out loud to you. On the hard days, ask them
  what they'd like you to read to them instead. Follow the words with your finger
  as you read so that they can be absorbing as they listen. Occasionally say that
  you are stuck on a word & ask them to help you sound it out, but mostly make
  it just about enjoying reading.

Neil Gaiman once said 'A book is a dream that you hold in your hands'. I like to think of books as a window to another world, through books we can travel to magical lands and far away places, that we might never get to visit in real life. A good story allows us to experience and learn whilst we journey through it. But what to choose? It's easy to get stuck in a reading rut. Child read what their peers are reading, and follow the crowd with the popular fiction of Tom Gates, Diary of a Wimpy Kid, and David Walliams. These are all great books (and lets face it, we are happy that they are reading at all sometimes!), but when children get stuck on an author they can find it hard to break into a new direction. So, here is a little inspiration for your reading, books that I've read and loved this year, and constantly recommend to young readers who have, in turn, loved them too:) The age range is there for a guide only—you will know your child's reading ability & sensitivity best!







# SCHOOL LIBRARIES DO NOT RECEIVE ANY GOVERNMENT FUNDING!

One of the saddest facts that I've learned since I took over the library is that the Government does not provide funding for school libraries or library books. In fact School Libraries are not seen as a necessity by a succession of governments.

Prisons however MUST have a library by law – which IS funded by the government.

Therefore – in order to be able to buy the books we need for the library, not only to replace the very aged stock and keep up to date with new releases, but also to replace the books that are returned damaged or simply lost – I have had to fundraise.

Fundraising events have had the support of so many of our wonderful parents and families, and have raised thousands of pounds over the years, resulting in lots of lovely new books to educate and inspire.
